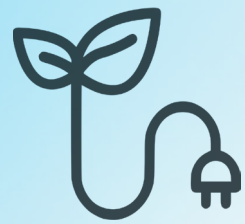


# How to save electricity at a rental cottage



## 1. Reduce hot water consumption

Cut out unnecessary hot water consumption. Shorten the time spent in the shower and wash dishes using the dishwasher instead of by hand.

## 3. Plan your electric sauna time wisely

Using an electric sauna consumes a lot of electricity. If you want to save electricity when using a sauna, keep your sauna sessions shorter and the temperature moderate. Remember to turn off the sauna heater immediately after use.

## 2. Keep the room temperature reasonable

Set the cabin heating to a comfortable temperature. An internal temperature of 20 degrees is often sufficient (check with the owner of the property that temperature control is allowed). If there is a heat-retaining fireplace at the property, moderate use will help heat the cabin and save energy.

## 4. Turn off appliances.

Keeping electrical appliances on without using them is unnecessary. Turn off the TV and the oven when you are no longer using them and unplug chargers.
